

Adult Track Journal Club 2021-2022

Journal Club is a monthly hour-long meeting where attendees discuss a thought-provoking article on a topic with relevance to our work as adult-focused researchers and interventionists in clinical psychology. The assigned “leader” rotates each month; that person is responsible for selecting an article, circulating it one week prior to the meeting, preparing discussion questions in advance, and leading the discussion in the meeting. In addition to discussing an article, Journal Club offers peer support to interns and postdoctoral fellows around common issues encountered at this career stage.

Attendance is required for residents. In contrast, the postdoctoral fellows who join make a year-long voluntary commitment to attend regularly. Residents are permitted one absence per year, and must arrive on time to be counted as in attendance.
